Edition Number 6 of Connect is upon us. We find ourselves, at the start of March, in the middle of Lent and heading rapidly towards Easter. The following week is Trinity Sunday which, unlike other festivals does not celebrate a festival or event in the life of Christ or the Church but rather a way of thinking and believing about God.

NEWS FROM THE CHURCHES

LEISTON UNITED CHURCH



PARTNERSHIP at Leiston, as is increasingly the case for all of us, is a major feature of the mission

section of our Mission Action Plan. We have identified a number of ways to build mission through partnership. Partners, in addition to the other churches of the Ipswich and East URC Pastorate, include Saxmundham URC, Local Community Projects such as Project 47 (in a neighbouring property) and Leiston Christians together.

We are continuing to hold discussions with Saxmundham as we move forward and joint services are now an established feature in our plans for worship. We make the most of these opportunities to share special moments and hear from different worship leaders.



Through **LEISTON CHRISTIANS TOGETHER** we are meeting monthly to pray together. In January we gathered at Leiston Baptist Church although we

arrived half an hour early but thankfully the folk there were ready to provide a welcome mug of coffee whilst others joined us. In February we met in the small side chapel at St Margaret's church and focussed in particular on a passage of scripture, marking the beginning of the Lenten period. On Tuesday 12th March (10:00am) we will gather at the Quaker Meeting House and on Tuesday 9th March (10:00am) at All Saints RC Church and on Tuesday 14th May (10:00am) we will be hosting the meeting at the United Church.



After a considerable period of discussion regarding the wording of the agreement we are please to report that the legal team representing

the URC Eastern Synod Trust have accepted the "ACCESS AGREEMENT" to enable the crossing of church ground to access the premises of the exciting **Project40Seven**.

The project provides а variety of opportunities for local artists, crafters and artisans as well as providing a "Library of Things" such as tools and devices, that people can borrow for various projects and then return for others to use. There is also a regular repair shop and the building hosts a Community Pantry which compliments the work of the Leiston Food Bank (hosted by LUC) and we are working in partnership in sourcing and sharing food. They also house

the refill shop offering an eco-friendly option.



The **FOOD BANK**, which is open every week from 10:00 – 11:30am on Friday and Saturday, is always grateful to receive donations both of

food and finance. We wish to extend our thanks to all those who continue to contribute on a regular or occasional basis to help us keep the shelves stocked.

We would like to acknowledge, in particular, a generous donation from the Rabble Chorus, who nominated us as one of the food bank projects they supported with collections taken at their Christmas concerts last year (2023). They sent us over £1300 which is a real boost and will enable us to continue to support those in need of extra help.

It tells the true story of Bernard Jordan who escaped from his care home to attend the 70th Anniversary of the D-Day landings in France. Afterwards we shared bacon (or vegetarian sausage) sandwich rolls and apple pies.

Our next film afternoon will be in April and will feature a "Golden Oldie" but we cannot say which one! We will let folk know the date and arrangements once they are confirmed.

CASTLE HILL URC



Last Autumn we launched a new

initiative called **WARM WELCOME – Coffee & Chat**. Every Tuesday morning from 10:00am to 12:00pm we open up the kitchen and meeting room to serve refreshments and snacks for any who wish to join for a time of friendship, conversation and some activities.

This builds on the monthly Coffee and Cake which still takes place on the first Tuesday and continues, incorporating the Warm Welcome. There is always an excellent choice of cakes to tickle the tastebuds and plenty of people to share in conversation.

It has been great to welcome so many folk and we hope to continue this as a regular thing going forward.



Once each month, on a Friday, Castle Hill are glad to host **FISH-N-CHIP FRIDAY.** Organized by Headway, with support from folk at Castle

Hill, it is an opportunity for those living with Dementia and their carers to get together and share in activities and entertainment. As the name suggests, each gathering includes a delicious meal of fish and chips. Sessions cost £10 which includes the food, tea, coffee and biscuits as well as any activities or entertainment. There is no need to book in advance as food is ordered and collected once numbers attending have been confirmed.

On 22nd December (2023), Fish-n-Chip Friday included a most enjoyable sing-a-long of Christmas carols. After our meal, with the addition of a cheeky mince-pie, an entertainer and friend of the group, gave us a seasonally inspired performance of music and song.



Beginning in January we are hosting a regular **AFTERNOON SERVICE** at Castle Hill at **16:00** in the meeting room. This is a service for anyone, across

the pastorate, to join in with. There had been a number of requests from folk at Castle Hill for this, we decided to give it a go.

Everyone is welcome to attend in person or you can log in to Zoom to participate. The next service will be on **Sunday 14**th **April.** (We are not holding one in March as we have the Lent service series).

CAFÉ STYLE SERVICE continues to be a regular part of our worship plan. The church is laid out with tables and chairs and drinks and snack are available throughout the worship time. We hold these about once a quarter.



Our most recent service of this type was held on Sunday 11th February. Our theme (as this was the last Sunday before Lent) was the Transfiguration which we explored through paintings (such as the one shown here) and examined the account of the events found in Mark's Gospel. The service included a short drama sketch, time for reflection and open prayer. One special treat was the sharing of pies, apparently a Transfiguration custom as the contents are hidden until broken open to reveal the filling.



Our February half-term gathering of "WONDERFUL WORLD", an activity for Primary and Lower secondary aged children was held on Thursday 22nd February. Our theme this time was "The Human Body — Excellent Engineering Inside and Out". We reflected on Psalm 139 especially verses 13

and 14, "You made my whole being. You formed me in my mother's body. I praise you because you made me in an amazing and wonderful way. What you have done is wonderful. I know this very well."

We discovered many things about our bodies and how they work. We explored our eyes by making pin-hole cameras and puzzling over optical illusions. We experimented with writing and drawing with both hands, explored the symmetry of our faces (no they aren't symmetrical) and attempted a range of challenges to see what we could or could not do.

ST JOHN'S URC



The **FRONT GARDEN** on the Spring Road has now received further attention. We have installed a smart new bench, adjacent to the

bus stop. The bench is fixed to a concrete base and will, hopefully, provide a welcome resting place for folk waiting for the bus.



The bench, manufactured by MARMAX is made from recycled plastic milk bottles.

These benches are highly resistant to wear

and, unlike timber, will not decay over time. Each bench uses several thousand milk bottles which are melted down, coloured and extruded to form the different elements and them screwed and bonded together.

You may recall that one reason for the need to develop the garden was damage done to the plants by a road accident in which an ambulance was forced off the road. Thankfully the dense bushes that were there absorbed much of the force of the collision, avoiding damage to the building.

Unfortunately in the early morning on Saturday 2nd December another road accident occurred, due to icy conditions. This time two cars were in collision and one was forced over the remaining bushes at the corner of Spring Road and Cowper Street. The car struck the corner of the church building damaging the fire exit door and shunting part of the wall inwards. We are now awaiting repair of the wall which will, at least in part, have to be rebuilt and a new fire escape door fitted.

COMMUNITY COFFEE continues to be a



regular feature in our monthly calendar. This takes place on the second Saturday of each month

from 10:30am to 12:00pm. There are often bacon butties alongside cakes and biscuits to be enjoyed and it provides a great opportunity for conversation and fellowship.

Following receipt of the **QUINQUENNIAL REPORT** on our building we, like several other



churches in the pastorate, are considering the work that has been recommended and prioritising tasks according to what can be done by our hard working in-house team and what will require professional input. For some of the more manageable tasks we have set aside a few "Work Mornings" which coincide with days when we have Community Coffee. The next one will be in April.

As with the other churches in the pastorate we have been continuing to work on our **MISSION ACTION**



PLAN and to explore ways in which we can develop our Worship, Nurture (pastoral care and discipleship) and Mission. At our February Church meeting we looked, in particular, at the Worship section of the MAP and considered ways in which different elements such as poetry, drama and art work and different formats, such as Café Style Worship might be explored. We will also consider ways of engaging further with the uniformed organisations (Brownies and Rainbows) who make use of the premises.



Those who participated and those who enjoyed the contributions from the Joint (Castle Hill & St John's) Singers at the Advent Service (held at

St Johns) and the Candlelit Carol Service (at Castle Hill) were keen that we should find other opportunities to sing and make music together.

In April, at St Johns, we are planning to hold another **HYMN SING**, to which, we hope, the joint singers will contribute. This will be on **Saturday 20th April** at **15:00**, followed by refreshments. All are invited to come and join in. Further details will be shared shortly

and Revd Adam will be in contact with those who took part in the joint singers as well as any others who would like to join the group, to make arrangements for a rehearsal.

FELIXSTOWE URC



On the second and fourth Tuesday of each month we hold a time of informal worship, in the small hall, entitled **REFLECTIONS**. These are

led by various folk and usually include questions on different themes, with discussions and sharing of ideas. In addition, Scripture Readings, Hymns and Songs, Prayers and other elements are included.

On Sunday 21st January, to mark the **WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY** the annual United Service organised by Churches Together in

Felixstowe, of which we are part, was held at St Peter and St Paul Church, Old Felixstowe. This event brought together Anglican, Baptist, Catholic, Methodist, Salvation Army, and United Reformed Church congregations. This year's theme, drawn from the parable of the Good Samaritan, posed a poignant question: "Who is my neighbour?" It aimed to prompt reflection on the essence of Christian love and its manifestation as sacrificial selflessness.

Bishop Peter Collins (Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of East Anglia), despite a challenging journey from Norwich that was doubled in time due to severe weather conditions, delivered a moving address. 'If I do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.' He spoke to the ecumenical congregation of 'Christian love having the potential for being the sublime expression of sacrificial selflessness.'"

The service underscored the commitment of Churches Together in Felixstowe to fostering unity and cooperation among the town's diverse Christian communities. It served as a vibrant platform for dialogue, prayer, and worship, encapsulating the event's core message of love and unity.



SAFEGUARDING is an important part of the work and commitment of each of our churches and part of the legal responsibilities overseen by the elders. On 22nd

January, a number of folk, all part of our pastoral team, undertook the foundation stage training, available as an online course, together.

The training material has been adapted following the launch of the new "Good Practice 6" the latest guidelines and policy for safeguarding published by the URC. The training ensured that we were up to date and refreshed our understanding of the key elements and procedures for securing safeguarding for all.



Felixstowe URC are also, as part of our MISSION ACTION PLAN seeking to develop partnership in mission in a variety of ways.

We continue to support the local Ukraine 2 Felixstowe project with the Hub Facility. They also now have a monthly, Sunday afternoon, gathering known as C4 - Coffee, Cake, Craft and Chat. They have undertaken a number of projects, there are activities for children and a bike repair service as required. Part of the reason for establishing this was to ensure that our Ukrainian guests have the opportunity to practice speaking English, with English folk, in an informal manner.



We are also to further activities and

partnership **FELIXSTOWE METHODIST** CHURCH. The churches, formerly known as Felixstowe Peninsula the Methodist Churches, have now joined to form one church in four locations, known simply as Felixstowe Methodist Church. They have one set of officers and stewards and one finance lead with resources shared.

As part of our Mission Action Plan, we have agreed to pursue a closer relationship and missional activities with the following objectives in mind:

- Ensuring inclusion of (at least) quarterly joint worship opportunities at either FURC of FMC (Trinity Site) in addition to Good Friday and Christmas Day. N.B. Our next joint service will be on Sunday 5th May.
- Share publicity regarding events and collaborate in longer term planning to

avoid duplication, increase mutual support of events and activities and compliment what is offered.

- Identify some kev collaborative missional projects in which to engage in partnership.
- awareness and fellowship Increase between members of the churches and share prayer needs for regular inclusion in worship and other prayer times.
- Investigate shared publicity opportunities for raising awareness of both churches in the community e.g. representation in simple wavs community events.




In early April we are planning **CHARITY** hold to а AFTERNOON TEA. This will be on a Saturday and the arrangements will be

Jo was also due to visit St Johns and Felixstowe but unfortunately was unwell. She is now back at work and we offer her our supportive prayers and blessing. Jo has a new date booked to come to St John's in October and will find an opportunity to visit Felixstowe in due course.



Our Pastorate LENT COURSE is now underway with folk from all of the churches taking part. Leiston and Saxmundham joining in via a Zoom link and sharing their own group discussions. We also

welcome folk from Christ Church URC and their minister Revd Neil Coulson, is joining Revd David and Revd Adam in leading and participating in the sessions.

The course entitled "The Long Road To Heaven" calls us to reflect on Salvation and

Faith's journey. It makes use of clips from the excellent film "The Way". The story of the film is very thought provoking and provides plenty of inspiration for reflection and discussion. It is particularly refreshing to learn how different people understand the issues raised and to develop confidence in talking about faith and our faith journeys.

NATIONAL & SYNOD NEWS



The last few years have seen considerable change. There is a significant contrast between church as it was twenty or even ten years ago and today. God is calling us to new ways of

thinking and challenging us to let go and let God lead us. Nationally the URC is engaged in the CHURCH LIFE REVIEW and looking at how resources, including finance can be more fairly shared and used. Slimming down on some of the many committee and officer roles and thinking more about the local impact of resources and support to enable churches to flourish is a priority.

With fewer ordained ministers available across the UK, each Synod is reflecting on how best to encourage churches to work together and benefit from the ministers who are available without simply adding to the number of churches that each minister Each Synod supports. has already implemented or plans to implement ways for calling and "deploying" ministers that best suit local need and situations. Eastern

Synod are introducing **MISSION** PARTNERSHIPS. This will mean some changes to the arrangements and working groups of churches, with a move away from Area Partnerships as they are at present.

Each church is invited to be part of a Mission Partnership, largely determined geographically, with practical considerations for future development. Different churches will engage in different ways.

At present the Ipswich and East Pastorate will continue as at present, five churches working together with our two ministers. Revd David and Revd Adam will share more about how other churches will engage with us at forthcoming Church meetings. There is hope and expectation built into the approach and we continue to look to God with faith and seek God's will.

FOR HOLY COMMUNION. This will mean that there is greater flexibility in enabling more of our local preachers and elders, with appropriate training, to preside at communion, including offering home communion.

As part of the developments the Synod Training Officer is arranging training for presiding at Communion. Any of those authorised who currently have not undertaken training in the last three years is asked to attend the training as a refresher alongside any nominated to take on the

role. Castle Hill URC will be hosting one of the training sessions, led by Revd Jo Clare-Young, on **Saturday 1**st **June 2024** from **13:30.**
