Minister's Letter June 2024

FAITH OR CONTROL

'The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' John 3:8

Recently David and I were blessed to take part in the Eastern and Thames North Synods' Spring School. As part of one of the sessions we were asked to consider some of things that might cause



us and our church families to be concerned as we look to the future and continue to discern God's will. In typical minister style those present managed to come up with a list of words beginning with the letter C (a habit of a lifetime forged in preparing sermons). One which stood out was "Control" or rather the fear of losing control.

I was reminded of an illustration I once saw of how the Holy Spirit works. We were watching a video as part of a Bible Study group. The presenter sat at a desk, by a window, as he spoke. The desk was neatly arranged with papers stacked and ordered in an elegant manner. As he spoke of the working of the Holy Spirit, he opened the window. The wind whipped in and sent the piles of paper in all directions. As Jesus explained in his conversation with Nicodemus (John 3), the Spirit moves freely as God wills and those who embrace the Spirit will likewise follow wherever we are led.

When we let the Holy Spirit lead and guide us in our lives and mission, things will look very different – our expectations and the familiar, comforting norms that we have established may or indeed will be challenge and rearranged.

Since the pandemic and lock-down period there is a real sense that rather than returning to the old patterns and ways, God has new things, new ways for us to be church in mind. We can be reluctant to embrace such change especially where it seems to undermine the familiar and we want to take control, holding on to what we know rather than letting God rule in our lives and church families – we fear losing control.

Richard Rohr, a Franciscan friar and ecumenical teacher said this, "The opposite of faith is not doubt; the opposite of faith is control." It's a challenging lesson to grasp. The challenge of God's will, the challenge of God's free and transforming Spirit is to let go and let God, wherever that may take us. Let us choose faith over control and learn to live fully under God's sovereign will, allowing the Spirit to work God's purposes in us and through us.

CARING FOR GOD'S CREATION

RESULTS OF CARING FOR CREATION QUESTIONAIRRE ANAYLISED

Thankyou to everyone who completed the Caring for Creation Questionnaire. 77 responses were received from the five Pastorate churches of which 31 were from Castle Hill.

The results for all five Pastorate Churches have been analysed and Adam has produced a spread sheet showing the results. Detailed copies will be distributed in the near future. They highlight where we are doing well and those areas in which we need to redouble our efforts to protect the environment.

The picture on the right shows how answers from each Church have been colour coded. The details are too small to read here but will be available when the results are published. They will also be available electronically.

Green indicates a majority of positive answers such as, for Castle Hill ,27 people take a shower rather than a bath with four taking a bath only. Orange

The process of the control of the co

indicates that the question's objectives are partly met such as nine people totally avoid single use plastics, 15 partly and five not at all. For the Red an example for Castle Hill only 10 people participated in Earth Hour, three people partly and 17 not at all.

The analysis enables us to compare our results with the other Churches and with the pastorate as a whole.

So look out for the complete analysis they make interesting reading..

VISIT TO ENERGY FROM WASTE FACILITY WEDNESDAY 26th JUNE at 1800



The staff have laid on extra guides to accommodate up to 18 people. So far, 14 have signed up so if you would like to join this two-hour visit please sign the list in the vestibule as soon as you can.

The tour incudes time in the Visitor Centre with some challenging exhibits on our use of energy and on the waste we produce.

I suggest that we meet up at the facility car park at 5.50 pm. if anyone needs a lift, speak to Len Green. Directions on how to get there are displayed in the vestibule.

Health and Safety

Regrettably, the visit is unsuitable for those with limited mobility or anyone who may suffer from vertigo as the tour involves walking for around 1.5 km and climbing open staircases with open grated flooring. Long trousers and sensible walking shoes must be worn. Shorts, skirts or dresses are not permitted. Personal protective equipment such as hard hats and safety goggles will be provided. Remember, this is an industrial facility. In the very unlikely event of an evacuation, visitors would be expected to descend 123 stairs. Please let Len know well in advance if you cannot manage this so that he can notify the facility who will then make arrangements to accommodate you safely.

All that being said, this will be a fascinating and most enjoyable visit.
